








DANANG ARRIVAL - BUS BREAKDOWN AND VESPA RESCUE

- Company t-shirts for drivers (optional)










FOUR SEASONS, THE NAM HAI



LOCATION Hoi An, beachside DESICN Contemporary and low rise ROOMS 60 room villas / 40 pool villas

Just 15 minutes' from the pretty town of Hoi An and fronted by nearly 25 miles of powdery, platinum-white sands sweeping all the way to Danang, the Four Season's location is inspiring. Previously known as The Nam Hai and long regarded as one of the finest hotels in Vietnam, this sultry seaside resort joined the Four Seasons hotel group at the end of 2016.

Aside from the incredible beach, there are no less than three glittering swimming pools to choose from. Most villas offer views over the South China sea and all are decorated in a sensuous, contemporary Asian style; peaked roofs, dark wood floors, soothing colours and textures, and plush outdoor spaces. The villas are generously proportioned, some have swimming pools whilst others sunken bathtubs.

TOK RESTAURANT

In the late afternoon we meet our driver with a vintage vespa on which we ride pinion through the streets of Hoi An and into the countryside on a beautiful journey of discovery. We'll cross an iron bridge to an agricultural island and drive through farmlands, villages and follow waterways lined with aquatic palms.

Finally we reach our end destination. Tok is a wonderfully unique and elegant restaurant serving beautifully prepared fusion cuisine using the finest local ingredients. Literally in the middle of the rice fields, the location is sublime. Relax on one of the lounge beds on the edge of the fields with the beverage of your choice and watch the sun melt into the horizon. Then investigate the creative menu and enjoy Tok's laid back fine dining experience on the terrace, under the stars.

FARM TO MARKET TO TABLE - WITH COUNTRYSIDE CYCLING DEPART 0830 - 1200 / LUNCH

We depart this morning with a minivan ride to Hoi An's Tra Que Organic Vegetable Village. Here you're introduced to various plants and herbs used in Vietnamese cooking. We pick up some bicycles and cycle through shaded neighbourhoods nestled among the the rice fields as we watch rural life unfold.

Buffalos walk across the road and block our way as we stop at a local Assembly House in the hamlet of An My for a refreshment stop served by ladies carrying drinks in the yolks.

We then continue by bicycle along quaint countryside rides before stopping at a local market on the north side of Hoi An. Our guided visit allows us to purchase some herbs and vegetables to be used in our cooking class later on.

Then we board our motorised sampan boats as we cruise up the Thu Bon River, past vast fishing nets and coconut water palms to our destination - the Red Bridge Restaurant and Cooking School. Here, beside the peaceful river bank we are guided and taught to create some of the traditional Hoi An dishes, such as rice paper rolls, papaya salad, ginger fish in clay pot and crispy Hoi An pancake – depending on the seasonal ingredients available.

The 2 hour session concludes with lunch on site. If competent in the kitchen or a skilled chef, this class may seem rudimentary. It is, however, a good entry-level class for someone seeking a first approach to Vietnamese cooking and with plenty of fun and some wine thrown in!

PROGRESSIVE DINNER HOI AN STYLE

INCORPORATING PRE DINNER AT THE FIELD, FIRST COURSE MAI FISH, MAIN COURSE MANGO ROOMS

Depart the resort on open top army jeeps! Cruise down the beach road and veer off towards to Hoi An, stopping at the Field for a pre dinner drink and snack overlooking the rice fields and river - a bucolic setting best seen as the sun fades for the day (we therefore recommend an early start to the dinner arrangements to take advantage of the early evening light).

Transportation awaits to whisk you off into town for our first sit down plated entree dishes of delicious Vietnamese cuisine with a twist at Mai Fish. Carefully selected, plants and bushes transform the courtyard and outdoor patio into a tranquil, garden-esque landscape.

Copper lighting casts a unique, golden glow over the tables. Meanwhile, the interior encourages you to relax. You're home. Paintings line the hallways, and ornate, wooden cabinets house antiques, locally made cups, glasses, and bowls. A combination platter is served with crispy rolls, beef in La Lot leaves, and papaya salad with prawns to delight the palette. Cold beer is on tap for those that need to quench their first on a warm tropical night.

We then whizz off up the road to our final stop tonight. Mango Mango Restaurant is a colourful eatery that offers a fun, experimental menu and a wide range of signature cocktails. Located along the tranquil Thu Bon River, near the lantern bridge and night market, The spacious, three-floor interior, outdoor patio, and upstairs terrace make it the perfect place to take in Hoi An's fresh, tropical air and people-watch. It also boasts impressive views of the famous Japanese Covered Bridge, just a two-minute walk away.







At the end of the evening return to the resort by awaiting motor coach.

VESPAS IN STYLE - HOI AN MICROCOSM! DEPART 1600 - 1800 / MORNING DEPARTURE POSSIBLE

The delights of Hoi An await on this see all, experience all in a microcosm of Vietnam!

In the late afternoon we meet our driver with a vintage vespa on which we ride pinion through the streets of Hoi An and into the countryside on a beautiful journey of discovery. This is the perfect time for our ride as the late afternoon light enhances the colours and there is often plenty of activity in the fields.

We weave through the traffic and the back streets of Hoi An's old town until reaching Chuc Thanh Temple. This is one of the finest examples in Hoi An of a working temple that has maintained its true character while many have lost their old world charm due to overzealous restorations.

We can feel the magic of this place as soon as we pass through the ornate gate and enter the carefully manicured gardens. Your travel expert will take this opportunity to explain the practices and intricacies of Buddhism in Vietnam.

We time our visit for late afternoon/early evening prayers. This is a highly spiritual experience that brings one merit and good fortune and a sense of calm in oneself.

Returning to our vespas we embark on the last leg of our journey. As the golden light of the late afternoon embraces us, we venture into the countryside. We'll cross an iron bridge to an agricultural island and drive through farmlands, villages and follow waterways lined with aquatic palms. RIVERS, RIDES & RUINS DEPART 0800 - RETURN 1230 OR 1400 - RETURN 1830

When discussing the ancient history of Vietnam, one cannot ignore the Cham people who occupied Central Vietnam before the Vietnamese conquered their Empire. My Son was the most important religious site for the Cham, it was where religious ceremonies for the kings of the ruling dynasties were held, as well as a burial place for Cham royalty and national heroes. It is also Vietnam's most important ancient ruin and pre dates the city of Angkor in nearby Cambodia.

Situated in the shadow of Cat Tooth Mountain (Hon Quap) My Son is an incredibly atmospheric and mystical place in a sublime setting with around 20 brick towers with carved sandstone lintels and pillars surrounded by forest and jungle.

Its a captivating visit and understandably popular, for this reason we encourage to start a visit later in the afternoon to arrive just before they stop admitting visitors for a more intimate experience of this site.

We provide an archaeologist/Cham expert (subject to availability), who is an authority on this site, to stimulate your imagination and really bring the site to life.

We suggest enjoying a peaceful boat trip on the Thu Bon River, combined with gentle cycling through picturesque countryside and villages. We use the coach/coaster vehicle to cover the majority of the 50kms and focus on the prettiest stretch of river and most interesting trails for cycling.

Return to Hoi An/Danang in the early evening.

Evening dining PRIVATE VILLA - A NIGHT OF ELEGANCE









PRIVATE VILLA - A NIGHT OF ELEGANCE

A private pool villa is the setting for an illustrious event on the sands of Hoi An beach. Pathways lit by a hundred candles guide guests through to the grounds of a villa where a single violinist in white serenades upon arrival. A 1.5 metre floral display of the client's company name stands as a backdrop to the ocean in front. At the grass area on the sides of the villa entertainment comes in the parade of LED dancers performing in darkness, seemingly lighting up areas of the space with electric coloured human figures.

A long table dressed in black silk and stylish white wooden chair set the scene for dinner. Independently named custom menus are provided along with initial embedded cloth napkins for that intimate touch, carefully placed among a bed of luxurious flower arrangements and candelabrums.

Large floral displays hang from an overhead truss in which an elegant chandelier provides the central point over the long table as a string quartet dressed in white entertain. Once dessert is ready, the lights turn off and drummers announce a parade of ladies dressed in white 'ao dai' with glowing conical hats coming in from the beach. Each one carries a yolk (Vietnamese baskets), filled with dessert for the close of the evening. As they gather around the tables, waiters serve the final dish delivered in traditional market style.

New venue sourcing is ongoing, constantly on the look out for locations that are authentic and representative of Vietnam's rich culture.


