





ATHAKON ARCHITECTURAL KHMER HOUSE

Athakon house is built on two large rice fields, which for many years were fed by streaming water originating from the Phnom Kulen holy mountain. The unique shape of the house is inspired by classic Khmer architecture.

The center of Athakon is an octagonal shape represents the Mount Meru and is the major meeting space where we will start with a predinner cocktail. At the raised ground level, the lobby is surrounded by four large pounds, filled with streaming water, plants and waterlilies.

At the top floor one can sense the open space beyond with a 360 degree view all around the landscape. Striking sunsets can be experienced from the high lifted lobby, while bridges and steps connect the lobbies with four central corner houses.

Descending the stairs, guests enter the garden and poolside which is the setting for a Khmer, cultural enthused evening with delicate lighting highlighting the architecture of the surrounding villas

During the course of the evening various performances of Khmer art and dance take place including the option to bring in the famed Phare Circus acts for a touch of contemporary meets comedy. Dinner may be plated or buffet style in a delightful garden environment.

DEPART 0500 - RETURN 1130 /12:30

We highly recommend an early (5am) departure by Remork convoy for a pre-dawn drive through the forests towards Angkor Wat's East Gate. A stunning introduction to the Temples of Angkor, lead by torchlight, we walk in the dark through the secluded East Gate to Angkor Wat itself.

Feeling refreshed and ready to tackle the temple itself we are guided through the complex. One very personal way to experience the spirituality of Angkor in even more depth is to participate in a Buddhist blessing ceremony. A monk blessing is a tradition that dates back hundreds of years in Cambodia, and is performed for special occasions and auspicious dates. We arrange this solemn experience in a private location within Angkor Wat on a request basis.


After exploring Angkor Wat we continue on road to Sra Srang (the baray, or reservoir of Angkor), to an exquisite traditional Khmer Wooden House for a full deluxe Khmer breakfast with fresh coffee and juice.

After breakfast, we will visit the monumental magnificence of Angkor Thom - last capital of the Khmers. After passing through the South Gate, you will go down along this shady road to the stunning Bayon temple. We will tour through the Bayon, a 12th century masterpiece which lies at the very centre of Angkor Thom and which is an archaeological wonder of symmetry and grandeur.

Continue to Ta Prohm, the 'Jungle Temple' that has been left largely in it's natural state since its 're-discovery' by French explorers. Surrounded by jungle, its labyrinth of stone hallways is overgrown with the roots and limbs of massive banyan trees, which envelop the stone like tentacles. It is one of the largest temples at Angkor, dedicated in 1186 of this site.

ADVENTURE SAFARI ON QUADS

DEPART 8:30 - RETURN 11:30

Safe and fun, our adventure safari on Quads is the best way to discover the countryside and remote villages around Siem Reap, taking you to places no one else does! This activity is suitable for everyone, with or without driving experience and is led by an experienced guide, respectful of the villagers and their environment.

Crossing dirt tracks and navigating through rice fields and local villages, this is a fun group activity and can be as adventurous or as 'easy' as need be.

Note: At the moment there are 25 quads, which can take a maximum of 2 pax per quad but the total weight can't exceed 130 kg per quad. For larger groups multiple departures can be staggered across a morning or afternoon.




















THOMMANON TEMPLE

Arriving at Thommanon Temple, a small and elegant temple located east of the Gate of Victory of Angkor Thom, the architecture echoes the elements of its slightly younger but much larger brother, Angkor Wat.

Stepping into the restored splendour of the 900-year-old temple complex, ones eyes drawn to the two cauldrons of flame that welcome guests at the entrance. Then escorted by a traditional band through bare-chested temple guards with their ivory-tipped antique spears. Torches light the way as guests process through the temple, arriving in front of a field of candles that illuminate the ancient structure. Monks, in their saffron robes, chant a welcome prayer from the temple alcoves.

The air is filled with the sound of music and the smell of incense. The Royal Apsara Ballet performers, dressed in their traditional costumes, glide through the shadows, their graceful movements casting intricate patterns on the walls.

The music is hauntingly beautiful, and the dancers' movements are mesmerising. After the dance, a Khmer infused banquet is served followed by a high-octane performance by the locally famed Phare circus. Throughout the evening, guests enjoy a different cultural performance in between each of the five courses of gourmet Khmer cuisine.

ANGKOR GRAND CIRCUIT BY VESPA

DEPART 0800 - RETURN 12:00 OR 13.30 - 17.30

Depart the hotel for an exhilarating drive riding pillion on Vespas as we head into Angkor. We pass through Angkor Thom marvelling at the Bayon in the morning light. We drive through what is known as the "Grand Circuit" to our first stop - is Preah Khan Temple.

Preah Khan is one of the most significant buildings erected during the ancient Khmer empire. Dedicated by the great king Jayavarman VII to his father in 1191, Preah Khan serves today as an outstanding example of a large linear temple complex in a dense jungle setting. With both Hindu and Buddhist characteristics, we take some time to explore this magnificent temple and browse some unusual carvings. The WMF (World Monuments Fund) are currently engaging in some restoration work here and, upon a very special request, we can organise a behind the scenes visit with the local WMF Archaeological expert, Ginevra Boatto.

After our Preah Khan experience, we return to the Grand Circuit road and continue to Neak Pean.

Built by Jayavarman VII before the end of the 12th century, this monument – Neak Pean or the entwined naga – is an artificial island, measuring 350 meters on each side, built in the middle of a reservoir which is also man made.

After Neak Pean we climb back aboard our vespas and contimue with an exhilarating ride around the rest of the Grand Circuit road to Sra Srang where we take a short stop, before returning to our hotel.

HALF DAY JEEP SAFARI TO SAN-DAY VILLAGE (with lunch)

DEPART 0830 - RETURN 1400

Depart by army jeep for an expedition through the thriving countryside, past rice paddy fields and local villages. We make a stop at a local villager's home to see how to make Khmer noodle in a traditional way and to taste a few dishes!

Continue with an ox cart ride and cycling in the village to experience village life then pause to enjoy a refreshment at a stop in a nearby rice paddy.

We then leave the village and continue by jeep to Bongthom Homestay - a unique community-based tourism site which captures the essence of village life in the heartland of Cambodia. Located in San-Day Village, Banteay Srey District and near the famed temple of the same name. Here an organic vegetable farm provides an abundance of local ingredients in which the local chef creates a range of traditional Khmer dishes for our lunch.

We may stop at Banteay Srei temple on our return for those that wish to see this exquisite site with its intricate sandstone carvings.

Located in the historic French quarter, opposite the National Museum, which houses the kingdom's greatest collection of ancient Khmer artefacts, guests check-in on the ground floor of a restored 100-year-old mansion—once belonging to a princess—before seamlessly seguing via a cavernous glassed-in foyer to the modern building behind and its 247 rooms and suites, with their views of the nearby Royal Palace, and the mighty Mekong. ARRIVE PHNOM PENH / AFTERNOON EXPLORATION

DEPART 0800 - RETURN 1130/1230

Depart your hotel mid morning for the short (30 mins) domestic flight to Phnom Penh, the capital city of Cambodia.

Upon arrival you are met and transferred into the city for lunch. Nestled on the banks of the Mekong River 'The Bale' is a contemporary lifestyle retreat enjoying sweeping views across the water. Surrounded by fragrant frangipani trees, spider lilles and lemongrass, the setting is as tranquil as it is beautiful. Enjoy a fine dining experience in the elegant Theato restaurant or dine outside by the pool.

From there we begin a short afternoon exploration of the city as we are whisked along the streets by 'cyclo' the traditional rickshaw. These old French colonial forms of transport are disappearing quickly as the city modernises as is a timely reminder of when the pace of life was slower. We explore the district around the old Post Office, then go to the area south-east of the Central Market where we pause for a look at this classic art deco building from the 1930's.

Phnom Penh's grandest site, however, is the opulent Royal Palace, which was built in 1866 by King Norodom. The Palace is actually a number of structures within a pagoda-style compound. Located within the Royal Palace compound is the Silver Pagoda, so named because of its floor, which is made up of 5,000 silver tiles. The treasures are a solid gold Buddha encrusted with 9,584 diamonds and weighing 90kilos and a small 17th century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha.

In the late afternoon we venture to our hotel for check in.

CONTRASTS OF CAMBODIA Part One













The National Museum of Cambodia houses one of the world's greatest collections of Khmer cultural material including sculpture, ceramics and ethnographic objects from the prehistoric, pre-Angkorian, Angkorian and post-Angkorian periods.

Housed in a graceful terracotta structure of traditional design (built 1917-20) just north of the Royal Palace, its central location and peaceful position opposite the waterfront, endures visitors with its impressive architecture. It is one of the most striking buildings still standing in modern day 'Indochina' and private access is only granted selectively.

The outdoor courtyard is connected to a central sculpture/statue via walkways and adjacent ponds. Here bamboo torches line the way with hundreds of candles alongside the pond edges. Cocktail tables are positioned throughout the courtyard with drinks and canapés served throughout the evening.

We recommend an arrival just prior to sunset to appreciate the soft light and changing colours of the building as dark ensues. While the interior of the museum is open to visit at the time of a private event, no food or drinks are allowed inside due to the highly prized value of the works of art in place.

As this location is filled with history and rich cultural relics of the Angkorean period we feel a string quartet is the ideal soft entertainment to provide as guests enjoy the evening arrangement.

We exit the museum to a convoy of Tuk Tuk's parked outside the entrance to whisk guests away into the warm tropical air to swanky Sora sky bar.


Looking down from the 37th-floor expansive terrace, the sprawling urban metropolis comes in full view. This outdoor space is ideal for medium to large group gatherings for cocktails and a heavy canapé dinner. Overlooking the ever changing skyline of Phnom Penh, the sweeping views ensure there is always something to look at and the setting requires little, if any, additional decor. There is also a small stage area for a jazz band, a string quartet or even a DJ for a more upbeat evening event.

The indoor bar area and whiskey bar provides overflow and a wet weather back up in case of showers but is also a destination onto itself. Whilst Phnom Penh is growing its range of cool bars and hip dining spots, the Sora remains the city's key drinking establishment with a view.

SHINTA MANI WILD TENTED CAMP

DEPART 0900 / ARRIVE 11.30

After breakfast we begin our overland journey out of Phnom Penh through the foothills of the vast Cardamom Mountain range and the National Park of Kirirom.

Despite the ongoing threat of logging the Cardamoms remain home to a vast array of rare animals and tropical flora. And thanks to the recent upgrade of roads and more community-based tourism projects cropping up, the tourist stream is starting to slowly trickle into the remote area. While much of the dense forest remains off limits to tourists – or humans in general – there are plenty of pockets to explore that showcase the area's biodiversity in all its glory.

Its rugged landscape, which takes in mountains, marshes, plains and gushing rivers, make it the perfect stomping ground for the vast collection of rare and endangered species that call it home. These include elephants, tigers – although spotting one is highly unlikely – sun bears, Siamese crocodiles, gibbons and clouded leopards.

Our immediate destination is the well regarded and luxurious Shinta Mani Wild tented camp - a radical new fusion of world-class design, hospitality and conservation. The camp was born when world-renowned designer Bill Bensley identified an unprotected, 350-hectare wildlife corridor – and set out to save it from poaching, mining and logging. Among the lush jungles, waterfalls and rivers are 15 beautifully-designed luxury tents that individually resemble Jackie O Kennedy's 1967 iconic safari to the Kingdom of Cambodia. It's a little bit of elegance, a little bit of nature and a whole lot of Bensley.

Enjoy an afternoon exploring the waterways of South East Asia's last wild estuarine ecosystem on the Bensley pontoon boats, or accompany rangers and researchers as they check the lands for illegal activity. For others who wish to take things easier enjoy the Boulders Spa that offer a full range of treatments in the tranquillity of the lush surroundings.

Wildlife Alliance Rangers Anti Poaching Patrol:




